ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 SECTION 14(1) **(SUTHERLAND SQUARE, ENID STREET, URLWIN STREET, JOHN RUSKIN STREET)**

(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Southwark hereby gives notice that to enable tower crane dismantling works by Centurion Traffic Management or its appointed contractor, it intends to make an order, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicular traffic from entering part of the above named roads.
2. Whilst the works are in progress, or whilst the authorised traffic signs/road markings are displayed, no person shall cause any vehicle to enter, proceed, stop, wait, load or unload at any time on the following roads:
 - (a) Sutherland Square, underneath and either side of the railway bridge.
 - (b) Enid Street, eastbound carriageway closed at the junction of Abbey Street, the westbound carriageway will remain open.
 - (c) Urlwin Street, from railway bridge to Camberwell Road.
 - (d) John Ruskin Street, underneath and either side of the railway bridge.
3. The alternative routes for affected traffic will be shown by the traffic signs displayed.
4. Exemptions will be provided in the Order to permit reasonable access to premises, so far as it is practical without interference with the execution of the said works.
5. The restrictions will not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works, or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.
6. The prohibition will be in place on: (a) 22:00 on the 4th of November to 06:00 on the 5th of November 2024. (b) 22:00 on the 5th of November to 06:00 on the 6th of November 2024. (c) 22:00 on the 27th of November to 06:00 on the 28th of November 2024. (d) 22:00 on the 6th of November to 06:00 on the 7th of November 2024.
