## RISBOROUGH STREET AREA IMPROVEMENTS

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Risborough Street area improvements) Order 2025

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 9 January 2025 it has made the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effects of the Order, in the vicinity of the development site known as Nos. 17-21 Risborough Street, the purpose of which would be to facilitate the priorities of the area and clear obstructive parking around new access points, are to convert existing 'timed' waiting restrictions (single yellow lines) to new 'at any time' waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following locations:(a) in COPPERFIELD STREET south side across its junction with Risborough Street (2.5 metres west and 2 metres east of the junction):
- (b) in LOMAN STREET north side across its junction with Risborough Street (14 metres west and 3 metres east of the junction); and (c) in RISBOROUGH STREET on both sides and between its junction with Copperfield Street and its junction with Loman Street.
- NOTES: (1) 'at any time' means at all hours on every day of the week. (2) All measurements are in metres and are approximate.
- 3. Copies of the Order, which will come into force on 13 January 2025, and of all other relevant documents are available for inspection at Highways, Southwark Council, Environment, Sustainability & Leisure, 3rd floor hub 2, 160 Tooley Street, London SE1 2QH, by appointment only. - 4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
