BOOKABLE PERMIT LOADING PLACES - BANKSIDE

The London Borough of Southwark (Bookable permit loading places) (No. 3) Order 2025

1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 18 December 2025 it has made the above Order under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effects of the Order, with the intention of improving the availability and turnover of kerbside loading (at times and locations of peak demand), is to designate new bookable permit loading places, for the use of authorised permit-holders' only at all times, at the following locations (*note that all measurements are in metres and are approximate*):
 - (i) BANKSIDE south side, from a point 8 metres west of the eastern wall of 'The Swan at the Globe', No. 21 New Globe Walk westward for a distance of 7 metres; and
 - (ii) BANKSIDE south side, from a point 17 metres west of the eastern wall of 'The Swan at the Globe', No. 21 New Globe Walk westward for a distance of 7 metres.
3. Permits for the use of bookable permit loading places (currently the charge will be £0.00 per permit, for any class of permitted vehicle), or for exception to waiting or waiting and loading restrictions in relation to authorised permit-holders' vehicles shall be granted with validity periods of either 15 minutes, 30 minutes or 1 hour, subject to availability.
4. Copies of the Order, which will come into force on 22 December 2025, and of all other relevant documents are available for inspection at Highways, Southwark Council, Environment, Sustainability & Leisure, 3rd floor hub 2, 160 Tooley Street, London SE1 2QH, by appointment only. 5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
