WAGNER STREET AREA IMPROVEMENTS

The London Borough of Southwark (Loading places and Waiting restrictions) (Wagner Street area improvements) Order 202*

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Wagner Street) Traffic Order 202*

1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The effect of the (Loading places and Waiting restrictions) Order would be:-
 - (a) to install a new inset loading bay which may be used for the purpose of loading only 'at any time' every day of the week (max stay 1 hour, and no return within 2 hours) in WAGNER STREET north-east side opposite No. 28 Wagner Street (15 metres in length); and
 - (b) in WAGNER STREET south-west side o/s Nos. 28 and 30 Wagner Street add 26.5 metres of new 'at any time' waiting restrictions.
3. The effect of the (Prescribed routes) Order would be to introduce a 'no entry' restriction which prohibits vehicular access from Ilderton Road into Wagner Street (which includes all pedal-cycles and e-scooters), and reinforces a north-westward 'one-way' operation in that part of Wagner Street, which lies within the boundary of the London Borough of Southwark (working with the corresponding 'one-way' operation within the rest of Wagner Street, within the boundary of London Borough of Lewisham).
There would be no exemptions to the above restrictions for emergency services.

NOTE: All measurements are in metres and are approximate.

4. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE under sections 90A to 90I of the Highways Act 1980 and in accordance with the provisions of the Highways (Traffic calming) Regulations 1999, propose to construct a raised speed table of flat-top construction having a maximum height level with the surrounding kerb, and covering the entire width of the carriageway in WAGNER STREET extending from the south-eastern kerb-line of Ilderton Road south-eastward for a distance of 6m (including ramps).
