


THE A200 GLA ROAD (JAMAICA ROAD, LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC AND STOPPING) ORDER 2026

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that it intends to make the above named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
2. The purpose of the Order is to enable Thames Water defective apparatus repair works to take place at A200 Jamaica Road.
3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from:
 - (1) proceeding in a westerly direction on Jamaica Road between its junctions with Southwark Park Road and Keeton's Road;
 - (2) stopping at the south-eastern kerb-line on Jamaica Road between its junctions with Southwark Park Road and Keeton's Road;
 - (3) entering or exiting Drummond Road at its junction with Jamaica Road.
4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (1) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
5. At such times as the prohibitions are in force alternative routes will be indicated by traffic signs for westbound traffic via Lower Road, Rotherhithe New Road, Southwark Park Road, Grange Road, Tower Bridge Road, Druid Street, Crucifix Lane, Bermondsey Street, Tooley Street and Jamaica Road to normal route of travel. for access to Jamaica Road from Drummond Road via Tranton Road and Collett Road to normal route of travel.

THE A205 GLA SIDE ROAD (UNDERHILL ROAD, LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC AND STOPPING) ORDER 2026

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that it intends to make the above named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
2. The purpose of the Order is to enable lamp column replacement works to take place at A205 Underhill Road in the London Borough of Southwark.
3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from:
 - (1) proceeding in a southerly direction on Underhill Road between its junctions with the vehicle access to Dulwich Court, Underhill Road and Lordship Lane;
 - (2) stopping on the eastern kerb-line of Underhill Road from its junction with Lordship Lane to the extended northern building line of Dulwich Court, Underhill Road.
4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (1) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
5. At such times as the prohibitions are in force an alternative route will be indicated by traffic signs via Underhill Road, Melford Avenue and Lordship Lane to normal route of travel.

The Order will be effective at certain times between the 16th January 2026 and 15th June 2026 every night from 8.00 PM until 5.00 AM or when the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. The prohibition will apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

RYEDALE TRIAL ROAD CLOSURE

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Ryedale area) Experimental Traffic Order 2026

- Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 8 January 2026 it made the above Experimental Traffic Management Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Experimental Traffic Management Order comes into force on 15 January 2026.
- The effects of the Experimental Traffic Order, the intention of which is to trial a part road closure in RYEDALE at its junction with Underhill Road and its accommodating measures in the area, are:
 - in RYEDALE to introduce a trial part road closure 'no motor vehicles' restriction, in that part of RYEDALE between the north-eastern kerb-line of Underhill Road and a point 30 metres north-east of that kerb-line (there will be no access for motor vehicles from Underhill Road into Ryedale and vice versa);

The 'no motor vehicles' restriction mentioned above would be operational 'at any time' every day of the week. Exemptions would be provided for emergency services vehicles only. The restrictions would be indicated by traffic signs and feature planters and moveable bollards.

 - new trial 'one-way' north-westbound working for all vehicles (except pedal-cycles) throughout the length of both BALCHIER ROAD and CORNFLOWER TERRACE; and
 - new accompanying trial measures prohibiting all vehicles (except pedal-cycles) from entering BALCHIER ROAD and CORNFLOWER TERRACE from DUNSTANS ROAD at those junctions and instructing right turns only for all vehicles (except pedal-cycles) from BALCHIER ROAD and CORNFLOWER TERRACE at their junctions with DUNSTANS ROAD.

Notes: (1) 'at any time' means at all hours on every day of the week. (2) All measurements are in metres and are approximate.

Anyone wishing to object to the Experimental Traffic Management Order being made permanent, or to make any other representation regarding the scheme would have 6 months to do so, from the date the Experimental Traffic Management Order comes into force (or, if the Experimental Traffic Management Order is varied by a subsequent Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, from the date that variation Order or modification comes into force), and may send a statement in writing to Traffic Order Consultations, Highways, Southwark Council, Environment, Sustainability & Leisure, P.O. - Any person desiring to question the validity of the Experimental Traffic Management Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Experimental Traffic Management Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Experimental Traffic Management Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
