- (1) entering, exiting, proceeding or stopping on Well Hall Road between its junctions with Westmount Road and Shooters Hill/ Shooters Hill Road;
- (2) stopping at the north-eastern kerb line of Westmount Road from its junctions with Well Hall Road to the extended south-eastern building line of Nos. 406 to 414 Westmount Road;
- (3) entering, exiting, proceeding or stopping on Broad Walk from the extended western building line of No. 314 Broad Walk to its junction with Well Hall Road;
- (4) turning right into Well Hall Road from Westmount Road;
- (5) entering, exiting or proceeding in a westerly direction on Westmount Road between its junctions with Castlewood Drive and Well Hall Road;
- (6) entering, exiting or proceeding on Westmount Road between its junctions with Castlewood Drive and Well Hall Road;

For access to Shooters Hill from Westmount Road via Rochester Way to follow the diversion route above. For access to Shooters Hill from Westmount Road via Well Hall Road to follow the diversion route above.
